



## **Red eyed squirrel**

There are currently no major threats to red-point squirrels. Since white squirrels do not have the camouflage offered by the grey/brown pelage of a typical grey squirrel, it might be thought that they would be more susceptible to predators. They also eat mushrooms, fresh leaves and sometimes eggs and insects of birds. A red squirrel can tell if a nut is good or bad before opening it from its smell. Pay attention to the mushrooms placed above in the forks of the branches of the trees in autumn: squirrels leave them dry before hiding them for the winter, along with the shops of seeds and nuts. Food items are stored individually (so called scatters-hoarding) rather than in large caches. A characteristic sign of nutritious squirrels is a littering of stripped cones under cone-bearing trees. A disorderly spread of cones and stairs will probably be left by a squirrel that feeds in the canopy, while a clean pile of nuclei and scales stripped near the shelter is more likely to have been a mouse or a vole feeding on fallen cones. Another classic sign of squirrel feeding is the hazelnut shell with a small nick chiselled in the apex, distinguishing them from the gnawed holes in the shells made by mice and voles. The Squirrelpox virus (SQPV) can be brought from gray squirrels without causing symptoms, but it is typically fatal for red squirrels within two weeks of infection. The destruction of the wood also contributed to the decline of the red squirrel. What do you do to help red squirrels in the UK? Throughout the UK, conservatives are working to ensure the future of red squirrel. Without action, the species could become dangerously threatened with extinction within a lifetime.
