Historically, animal studies were often neglected, but thanks to the combined efforts of historians, zoologists, anthropologists, ethnomusicologists, and linguists over several decades, animal studies have flourished. Medieval iconography played a crucial role in this investigation by providing insights into the medieval bestiary. This genre was characterized by its use of animals and mythical creatures in media, such as seals, coats of arms, sculptures, architectural elements, and illustrations. These beasts were often depicted on church interior walls, stained-glass windows, and bestiaries, as well as a teaching device for the illiterate population. The text described overhandedly and speciously stories, reflecting the Trouvère tradition of focus on earthly love. A scene from this time period is depicted next to an image of a lion. Richard de Fonsval took inspiration from earlier bestiaries but used his knowledge as a doctor and chancellor to create a unique, parodic work that detailed the trials of a romantic relationship. The Bestiaire d'Amour gained widespread popularity across Europe, with its erotic themes being one of the most notable aspects of medieval literature at that time. Lions were frequently depicted in church art and royal menageries, symbolizing power, courage, wisdom, and justice. However, they also represented Christ and Satan in different contexts. The lion's association with royalty was reflected in Richard the Lionheart, King of England, while its ability to sleep with its eyes open made it a preferred guardian. Despite being associated with darkness, the positive symbolism of the lion gradually became more prevalent over time. Lion of Saint Mark became an emblem of the Venetian Republic, representing the Christian faith in broader terms. In medieval times, people believed that dragons existed and were thought to be evil or possessors of treasure. The Latin term "draco" described Satanic in the Bible. Only brave heroes like Saint George and Saint Michael could defeat it. The unicorn also appears in medieval bestiaries, such as those by Pliny the Elder and Pierre de Beauvais. It is described as a ferocious animal with the body of a horse, the head of a stag, elephant feet, and a boar tail. Initially, unicorns were depicted as violent creatures but later became symbols of purity in Christian culture. They are often associated with Virgin Mary and Jesus Christ. The unicorn's horn was said to have healing properties, leading to its hunting for this purpose.
