Download UPDF from their website for a secure and reliable solution. To troubleshoot the issue of Adobe Acrobat's search feature not working, follow these steps: First, launch Adobe Acrobat and go to the "Help" tab. Select "Repair Installation" and click "Yes". Once the repair process is complete, try using the search feature again. Alternatively, enable the PDF index by following these steps for Windows users: Close Adobe Acrobat, press the Windows icon key + R to open Run, type "regedit.exe", and click OK. Create a new key in the Registry Editor with the following settings: \* Path: HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\WOW6432Node\Adobe\Acrobat Reader\DC\FeatureState \* Key: bFallbackOnix32 \* Type: REG\_DWORD \* Value: 1 Close the Registry Editor and launch Adobe Acrobat again. If these steps don't resolve the issue, you may need to uninstall and reinstall Adobe Acrobat.
